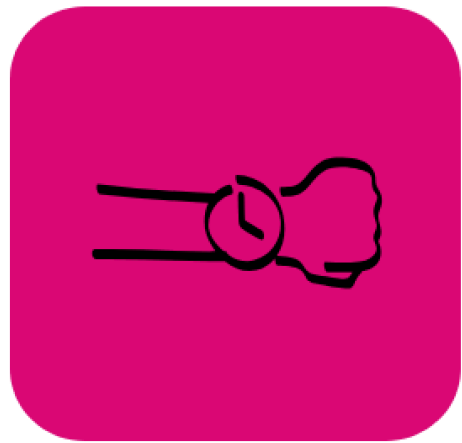


Question: Do the FQHCs meaningfully embody the Patient Centered Medical Home Model?
